PROVIDER ALERT: DC MAP MATERNAL ISSUES DURING PREGNANCY AND POSTPARTUM CASE DISCUSSIONS

On October 19, 2022 (12:00pm to 1:00pm), DC Mental Health Access in Pediatrics (DC MAP) will present case discussions on “Maternal Issues During Pregnancy and Postpartum”. Target audience is Pediatric Primary Care Providers.

This course will provide an evidence-based overview of the diagnosis and treatment of mood and anxiety disorders in pregnancy and the postpartum. Practitioners will gain an understanding of both the risks of untreated psychiatric illness and the risks of using psychotropic medications in pregnancy and the postpartum to both the mother and fetus or neonate. This talk will serve as a practical guide to assist providers with assessing patient symptoms, engaging in risk assessments, and developing appropriate treatment plans for this unique patient population.

MEET YOUR TRAINER

Dr. Lindsay Standeven, MD is an Assistant Professor of Psychiatry at Johns Hopkins and the Clinical and Education Director of the Center for Women’s Reproductive Mental Health. She is the director of resident training in women’s mental health and serves on the educational board of the National Curriculum on Reproductive Psychiatry (NCRP). Her research focuses on the role of neurosteroid changes in pregnancy and PMADs. She has also received NIH funding to study the role of neurosteroids and the psychiatric symptoms of women with Polycystic Ovary Syndrome, which is a leading cause of infertility.
